Description

The Prize was established in 2024 and is funded by Tamaki Health, a privately owned New Zealand healthcare group.

The Prize is intended to stimulate interest in general practice, as a career, amongst Māori students and Pacific students.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of Department of General Practice and Primary Health Care (or nominee)

Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Tamaki Health Prize in General Practice.
- 2. Two Prizes will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$2,000 each.
- 3. One Prize will be awarded to the Māori student who achieved the highest overall marks for the General Practice attachment of the MBChB Part VI and one Prize will be awarded to the Pacific student who achieved the highest overall marks for the General Practice attachment of the MBChB Part VI.
- 4. The Prizes will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of Department of General Practice & Primary Health Care (or nominee).
- 5. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 6. In the event of a tie, the Head of the Department of General Practice & Primary Health Care (or nominee) will determine if the Prizes may be shared.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations, in consultation with the donor, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
- 8. Note [I] below is deemed to be a regulation.

Notes

- I. Tamaki Health will arrange presentation of the Prizes.
- II. These regulations are subject to Senate and Council approval.
