## **Description**

This Prize was established in 2000 by Mr Peter Turner in the memory of his late mother Te Ruakawhena Gretha Winiata, who was studying for a Certificate in Adult Education at the University of Auckland. Te Rua studied Continuing Education in 1992 and, encouraged by the experience, subsequently enrolled in the Certificate of Adult Education.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Education and Social Work (or nominee).

## Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Te Ruakawhena Gretha Winiata Memorial Prize.
- 2. The value of the Prize will be \$500.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded annually to a suitable candidate who excels in the Postgraduate Certificate in Academic Practice.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Education and Social Work (or nominee).
- 5. The University of Auckland Council will not be bound to award the Prize in any year if there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 6. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Education and Social Work shall determine if the Prize may be shared.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council will have power to amend or vary these Regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
