## Description

The Prize was established in 2021 and is funded by Tompkins Wake, a New Zealand law firm.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise and encourage excellence in the study of competition law.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Scholarship is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law

## Regulations

- 1. The Prize will be known as the Tompkins Wake Prize in Competition Law.
- 2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
- 3. The Prize will be awarded to the student enrolled in a Bachelor of Laws (LLB) or associated conjoint degree, or Bachelor of Laws (Honours) who achieved the highest mark in LAWCOMM 422 Competition Law. As a minimum standard, the student should have achieved an A- grade.
- 4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Law (or nominee).
- 5. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Law (or nominee) will determine whether the Prize may be shared.
- 6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
- 7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations, in consultation with the donors, provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
