## Description

---

The Prize was established following a gift from the Auckland Classical Association in 2005.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise achievement in Classical Studies and Ancient History at Stage I.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the W.K. Lacey Prize in Classical Studies and Ancient History.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500.
3. The Prize will be awarded annually to the full-time student who achieved the highest mark in a Stage I Classical Studies and Ancient History course in the year of the award. As a minimum standard the student must have achieved an A- grade. In the event of a tie, the Prize will be awarded to the student who achieved the highest aggregate marks across Stage I Classical Studies and Ancient History courses.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for Classical Studies and Ancient History (or nominee).
5. The Prize may not be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
