### Description

---

The Wolters Kluwer Prize was established in 2009 by the Faculty of Medical and Health Sciences.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise the final year student who has achieved the highest academic and clinical practice performance throughout the Bachelor of Nursing programme.

### Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the School of Nursing

### Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the Wolters Kluwer Prize.
2. The Prize will be \$500.
3. The Prize will be made annually to the final year student who has achieved the highest academic and clinical practice performance throughout the Bachelor of Nursing programme (see Note II).
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council upon the recommendation of the Head of the School of Nursing (or nominee).
5. The Prize may not be made in a particular year if there is no candidate of sufficient merit.
6. The Prize may not be shared.
7. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
8. Notes [I]-[II] below are deemed to be regulations.

### Notes

---

1. *This Prize is presented at the Qualifying and Completion ceremony each year.*

*II. A shortlist of students to be considered for this prize is generated by clinical lecturers in NURSING 301 and 302 and will include students who have demonstrated excellent clinical performance. The prize will be awarded to the student with the highest GPA, generated from all Bachelor of Nursing courses. In the event that a number of students are eligible, the GPA will be recalculated double weighting the grades for NURSING 301 and 302.*
