

# Hilary Chung Prize in Global Studies

## Description

The Prize was established in 2021 and is funded by an appeal in memory of academic Hilary Chung, who was instrumental in establishing the Bachelor of Global Studies in the Faculty of Arts.

The main purpose of the Prize is to recognise and reward the most academically meritorious Bachelor of Global Studies students.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Scholarship is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Arts

## Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the Hilary Chung Prize in Global Studies.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,000.
3. The Prize will be awarded to the full-time student who has completed the requirements for a Bachelor of Global Studies (see Note I) in the year of the award, who achieved the highest grade point average (GPA) across the entirety of their Bachelor of Global Studies programme. As a minimum standard, the student should have achieved a GPA of 7.00 (equivalent to an A- average). In the event of a tie, the Prize may be awarded to the student who has demonstrated the highest level of commitment beyond their academic work to leadership, teamwork, public speaking, critical thinking, research and communication (see Note II).
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Dean of the Faculty of Arts (or nominee).
5. In the event of a tie, the Dean of the Faculty of Arts (or nominee) will determine whether the Prize may be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
7. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets

the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.

8. Notes [I]-[II] below are deemed to be Regulations.

- I. Students enrolled in a conjoint degree must have completed the requirements of the Bachelor of Global Studies component of their programme to be considered for the Prize.*
- II. Commitment will be demonstrated by participation in activities including, but not limited to, volunteering, student leadership and engagement (Auckland University Global Studies Society (AUGSS), Uniguides, mentoring, Open Day), community engagement and advocacy.*
