## Description

The Prize arises from a fund raised by subscriptions among past and present students, colleagues and friends of the late Professor Heathcote Briggs, Emeritus Professor of Chemistry and a member of staff of the Chemistry Department from 1933 and 1975.

## Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Chemical Sciences (or nominee)

## Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the L H Briggs Memorial Prize.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$500 as well as a bronze medallion.
3. The Prize will be awarded to the student adjudged to be the most distinguished research worker in the School of Chemical Sciences who has completed a thesis for the degree of PhD in Chemistry, PhD in Food Science, or PhD in Forensic Science during the calendar year of the award (see Notes I and II).
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Head of the School of Chemical Sciences (or nominee), in consultation with the Supervisors of the candidates for the Prize.
5. The Prize may not be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the criteria and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
8. Notes [I]-[II] are deemed to be Regulations.

## Notes

- I. For the purposes of this Prize, “completed” means that all requirements for the award of the doctoral degree have been satisfied.*
- II. All completed theses for the degree of PhD in Chemistry, PhD in Food Science, and PhD in Forensic Science lodged with the Graduate Centre between 1 January and 31 December of any year shall be considered for the Prize that year, no special application being necessary.*
