Description

The Prize was established in 1995 in memory of Professor Sally Harvey, Prince of Asturias Chair in Spanish.

The main purpose of the Prize is to encourage students undertaking postgraduate research in Spanish.

Selection process

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee)

Regulations

1. The Prize will be known as the Professor Sally Harvey Memorial Prize in Spanish.
2. One Prize will be awarded annually and will be of the value of \$1,200.
3. The Prize will be awarded to the student enrolled in a Master of Arts in Spanish or a PhD in Spanish, Latin American Studies, or Comparative Literature with a research topic related to Spanish or Latin America, or a Master of Global Studies with a research topic related to Spanish or Latin America, who shows special aptitude for research as demonstrated by a combination of the following accomplishments: i) publication or publication acceptance of an article in a reputable journal or volume, ii) presentation at a national or international conference where selection is through peer review, iii) contribution to the promotion of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (CLL) academic and research culture, and iv) having been awarded a research scholarship or fellowship outside the CLL or Waipapa Taumata Rau, University of Auckland.
4. The Prize will be awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee) in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for European Studies (or nominee).
5. In the event of a tie, the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Cultures, Languages and Linguistics (or nominee) will determine, in consultation with the Major/Specialisation Leader for European Studies (or nominee), if the Prize may be shared.

6. The University of Auckland Council is not obliged to make an award if it is determined there is no candidate that meets the requirements and/or no candidate of sufficient merit.
7. The University of Auckland Council can amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Prize.
