## Description

---

The Award was established in 2016 and is funded by Stephen and Laura Dee.

The main purpose of the award is to recognise, reward and encourage students majoring in English to undertake further study in English Literature at postgraduate level.

## Selection process

---

- Nomination is made to the Scholarships Office
- The Prize is awarded by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities

## Regulations

---

1. The Prize will be known as the Stephen and Laura Dee Award in English Literature.
2. The annual value of the Award will be \$2,000.
3. The Award will be made to the most academically meritorious and promising student undertaking an honours year in English, taking into account all previous English Literature work examined in the qualifying degree programme (see Note I).
4. The Award will be made by the University of Auckland Council on the recommendation of the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities.
5. In the event of a tie, the Deputy Head (Academic) of the School of Humanities will determine, in consultation with the donor, if the Award may be shared.
6. The University of Auckland Council has the power to amend or vary these regulations provided that there is no departure from the main purpose of the Award.
7. Notes [I]-[II] are deemed to be Regulations.

## Notes

---

- I. Courses considered will include those concerned with the study of literature written in English but exclude those primarily focussed on theory, creative writing or cultural/writing studies. The Faculty of Arts will be required to provide a brief outline of their selection process to the Scholarships Office.*
- II. The Award will be made annually in Semester One.*
