Supporting the University Community

This year the Society sponsored students from the Auckland University Robotics Association (AURA) who were able to attend, and went on to win, the 2017 VEX U Robotics World Championships in Kentucky.

The Society also contributed \$500 towards the cash prize for the Doctoral winner of the 2017 Three Minute Thesis competition, who was Miriam Seifert from the Business School, with her thesis title: "The Influence of Anti-consumption on a Firm's Abilities to Achieve a Competitive Advantage – Case Studies from the Slow Fashion Movement."
