


Graduate Destination Survey 2019



2019 Graduate Destination Survey Findings

The University of Auckland's second Graduate Destination Survey was launched on the 30th of October 2019. In total, 11,519 graduates (excluding PhD graduates) who completed their qualification in 2018 or early 2019 were invited to participate. The survey had a response rate of 25% (2017: 22%). 64% of all respondents were female, and 36% were male.

Employment

The employment rate for 2018 and early 2019 graduates was 96% - 0.6% higher than 2017 result and ranged from 95.2% for Undergraduates students to 96.5% for Postgraduates students. The median salary reported by respondents remained between NZD50,00 - NZD60,000, irrespective of the level of qualification and faculty graduated.

Further Study

24% of the total respondents indicated they are engaged in either full-time or part-time studies (2017: 24%). 63% of them are doing postgraduate or higher degrees. 'To improve my career options' and 'enhance my knowledge in my specialist field' remained the most popular main reasons for taking up further study. More than half of those who are currently doing further study chose to stay with the University of Auckland.

Programme Satisfaction and University Experience

79% of all respondents expressed satisfaction with the quality of their programme (2017: 82%). The vast majority indicated their programme was worthwhile. About 90% of respondents agreed their programme helped them with developing skills in finding information and using it effectively and gave them a broad overview of their field of study. 73% of all respondents will recommend their programme to others, and 77% will recommend the University of Auckland to others.
