Cultivating social transformation: the intersection of policy and leadership

A one-time doctoral fees-only bursary is available for an outstanding applicant for the Doctoral of Education (EdD) degree. The successful applicant will undertake an EdD with a supervision team from education and public policy.

ABOUT THE BURSARY

- This Faculty of Education and Social Work bursary is for an EdD student who will join the cohort starting in March 2024
- The bursary will cover the Student Services Fee and compulsory domestic tuition fees for a Doctor of Education (EdD)
- The bursary will be awarded for a period of up to 36 months full-time equivalent. Part-time awardees will be paid pro-rata for up to 72 months
- Applicants who already have a doctorate or are currently enrolled in a doctorate are not eligible for consideration

Expressions of interest due 1 October 2023; Application for doctoral programme due 1 November 2023; Enrolment in doctoral programme required by 1 March 2024

The cross-disciplinary team is interested in the confluence of policy, leadership, and organisational structures and processes that create the possibility for dismantling inequity in schools and school systems. The ideal EdD candidate for this bursary will engage in an EdD thesis that examines ways in which leaders can be equipped with the knowledge, skills, and aptitude to create equitable organisational environments. An appropriate research focus for the bursary recipient would include interdisciplinary studies looking at, for example, efforts to establish organisational cultures that reduce bias through alignment of policy and practice. Proposed studies can be conducted within or outside of formal education settings in Aotearoa New Zealand. However, the part-time nature of the EdD makes this bursary unsuitable for someone on an international student visa.
