Thesis Enrolment

Prior to enrolment in a Thesis, you must complete a Research Methods Course and apply for Research Approval through the Postgraduate Research Approvals and Examinations sub-committee. (This is not Ethics approval - that process is completed with your supervisor).

The steps you need to take are as follows:

- Decide on a research topic and describe this for yourself, once you have a description
- Look for those with a similar interest area and review the list of potential supervisors on the **Supervisor Register**.
- Send emails to potential supervisors in the Faculty along with your description of the research you would like to engage in
- Once you have found a supervisor and are both happy with your proposal, please **submit your research proposal online**.

It will then be tabled at the following meeting of the Postgraduate Research Approvals and Examinations sub-committee. For further information, please see **Guide to Theses and Dissertations**.
