GENERAL SCIENCE

Two or more 300 level courses in either Physics, Biology or Chemistry AND
Minimum 100 level courses across two or more science areas. Relevant areas are biology, chemistry, physics, environmental science, agriculture, horticulture, astronomy, geology, physical geography, human biology.

MATHS

Minimum 2x 100 level courses in Math/Stats, however more preferred.
For entry into Senior Maths you will need 300 level courses.

JUNIOR ENGLISH

Minimum 2x 100 level English, however 200 level courses preferred as well as higher level courses in Media, Film and Theatre Studies.

LANGUAGES

Major to 300 level in chosen language, or native/fluent speaker and writer of the language. May require further assessment.

PHYSICAL EDUCATION

A Bachelors degree is PE consisting of the following courses:

1. Bio-physical sciences – anatomy, exercise physiology, biomechanics, motor learning/skill acquisition.
2. Socio-cultural studies – philosophy, sociology of sport and physical activity, cultural studies.
3. Physical Education - two or more of: Outdoor Education, Health Education, Education, Curriculum and Pedagogy, Sport and Coaching Pedagogy.

* At least one discipline or subject should be taken to 300 level, with a balance of others at 200 level.

SOCIAL SCIENCES

300 level papers in a social sciences
subject e.g. History, Geography,
Sociology, Political Studies, Social
Anthropology, Law

TECHNOLOGY

These courses are designed for those who wish to specialise in teaching technology. Students entering these courses will need to have a degree or equivalent and working experience in a relevant field of study that ranges from Food, Hospitality, Nutrition, IT, digital design, Architecture, spatial design, product design, construction, engineering, electronics trades, fashion/textiles, jewellery, sound, stage/set design if you are contemplating working in areas of teaching with specialist work room/workshop environments and equipment it is important that you have had some 'hands on' experience either through career or interests to bring to teaching.

MUSIC

Minimum 300 level papers in music including music analysis and history (pop, jazz, or classical).

ART

Fine arts degree or equivalent (e.g.
Bachelor or Master of Fine Arts, 3 year
Dip Fine Arts).

DRAMA

300 level papers in drama or theatre studies. Students with experience in performing, directing or stage craft will also be considered.
