





In Year 2 you will generally take two BHSc Elective courses. The five BHSc pathways are packages of courses that lead in the direction of specific health sector roles.




Māori health is a fundamental component of the BHSc and therefore integral to all five pathways. MAORIHTH 201 is a core paper in the degree, and students wishing to deepen their knowledge should also take MAORIHTH 301 in Year 3. POPLHLTH 312 (Health and Pacific Peoples) and POPLHLTH 313 (Health in Asian Communities) can be taken in conjunction with any of the five pathways.
