- These prices will be reviewed in September 2021 in consultation with whānau, as per our fees policy.
- It is the whānau responsibility to advise the Kaiwhakahaere of any change of circumstance that affects the fees i.e. change from staff to student or community. University of Auckland reserves the right to charge the difference if not advised of the change.
- A whānau discount is offered to Under 3's if more than one tamaiti from the whānau attends.
- Meals are charged separately and not included in these fees.

Terms and conditions of enrolment and fees

Procedures for tamaiti care fees charged & FAQ's

What do I need to have in place before my tamaiti can begin at the service, and when can I start?	When all documents are received your tamaiti are loaded into our childcare software system and fees will begin being charged according to your start date We ask that all childcare fees are paid two weeks in advance to cover the two-week notice period.
How are tamaiti care fees charged, what is being charged and when?	At the University of Auckland (UOA) childcare centres and Te Kōhanga Reo we charge regular fees for all absences included statutory holidays. The only time UOA does not charge regular fees is over the approximately two-week Christmas and New Year closure period. Regular fees are charged when your child is sick or absent unless stated otherwise in the holiday and absence procedure. Fees are to be paid two weeks' in advance by Automatic Payment, Internet Banking, EFTPOS or Salary Sacrifice if UOA staff. Failure to keep fees up to date may result in your enrolment ending, and the debt being passed on to a collection agency, for



	which the whānau will be responsible for any associated costs incurred. We do value the relationships we have with whānau and would rather you talk to us if you are struggling to meet your payments, there may be options available to you that you may not be aware of.
Do you provide make up days and changes to enrolment days and times?	We do not provide make up days of any kind. Changes to enrolled days and times are possible if they are given with two weeks' notice in writing to Kaiwhakahaere – this could be via email.
Do you have a notice period?	Our services require a two-week notice period to make any changes to enrolments including cancellation of enrolment
Is there a minimum booking?	There is a minimum booking time of 2 days per week or 2 sessions of 4 hours, in either the morning or afternoon – dependant on the centre structure. <i>Please note that "sessions" are only available to student whānau</i> .
Is there a late fee if I collect my tamaiti after their booked hours?	We will always try and support our whānau where we can, if you are running late please let us know, if it becomes a habit, you may be asked to pay a late fee to cover some of the overtime have to pay our kaiako.
Do you support WINZ subsidies and other support grants.	Absolutely! We love these to be completed before your tamaiti begins at our centre but understand circumstances change over their journey. We will help you with all the paperwork you need. Details of this subsidy can be found here: https://www.education.govt.nz/early- childhood/funding-and-data/20-hours-ece-for-ece-services/ The ECE subsidy is provided to children aged 3 years and older and under the strict rules given by the Ministry of Education.
Do you provide statements?	We do, these arrive in your email inbox each week. You are normally billed two weeks in advance to cover the cancellation period. If you are not receiving them, please just let us know.
Do you provide nappies?	 Only one of our centres provides nappies – this is Te Ako o Te Tui in Grafton. The nappy charge of \$4.00 per week. This will be charged to your account on your booked days.

Procedures for holidays and discounts

Sibling discount



A discount of 10% is offered to whanau with two or more tamariki at UOA services.

- Multiple child discount only applies to the youngest of the children and only until the child turns three. Once the additional tamaiti/tamariki turn three no ongoing discounts apply, as they will be accessing the 20-hour ECE subsidy.
- If and when the older of the sibling leaves, the multiple sibling discount will also end. If the tamaiti is still under the age of three, regular fees will then be charged.
- The multiple tamariki discount is only applied to one tamaiti. If you have three or more tamariki this will be case-by-case and to be discussed with the ECE General Manager via the Kaiwhakahaere.

Holidays and Absences

University of Auckland Students

- For absences of less than a week, full fees are payable.
- If a child is away for a full week and up to three weeks, a holding fee will be charged, which is usually half the normal fee. Application is required in writing at least one week in advance.
- Absences in excess of the three weeks will require payment of full fees to retain your tamaiti's place as we will lose the Government funding after 15 days.
- If absences are not advised in advance, full fees may be charged.
- Fees will not be charged for absences during the months of December and January as long as notification of a child's absence has been received.
- Where a public holiday falls on a day a tamaiti is enrolled, the parent shall be charged for that day with the exception of Easter Tuesday, which is a University holiday.

University of Auckland Employees

- For absences of less than a week, full fees are payable.
- If a child is away for a full week and up to three weeks, a holding fee will be charged, which is half the normal fee. Application is required in writing at least one week in advance.
- Absences in excess of three weeks will require payment of full fees to retain your tamaiti's place.
- If absences are not advised in advance, full fees will be charged.

Community Whānau

We have negotiated to charge our community whānau at the discounted University Employee rate as a commitment to providing quality care and education is these unique environments and making it available for all. This is a significant discount for whānau and therefore we are not able to offer any further discounts including around holidays an absence.

- All absences are charged at the full rate.
- Fees will not be charged for the period over Christmas where the University closes (approximately 2 weeks) these dates are confirmed closer to the end of each year in line with any fee increases.
