What is a DMP?

A Data Management Plan (DMP) outlines how research data will be managed throughout your project. It is a living document that you should update as research progresses.

A DMP is required for research projects involving **sensitive or **restricted** research data.**

The University has an **online DMP tool**, replacing the existing text-based DMP template.

The DMP tool contains guided support and **easy-to-use** features designed to simplify data management tasks and save you time in the future.

What are the benefits?



Protects research data

Helps you organise, document and store data securely to **reduce the risk of data loss** or unauthorised use of project data.



Facilitates collaboration

Keeps project information in one place where it can be shared and discussed with your supervisor and project team.



Compliance and best practice

Meets University, ethics and funder requirements and demonstrates Good Research Practice (GRP).



Prepare for the future

Helps you plan for data preservation and sharing, enabling future reuse of data and increasing the visibility of your research.
