


Master of Organisational Psychology (MOrgPsych)

MOrgPsych has a Research stream and a Taught stream

Recognising the diversity of aspirations within students who seek postgraduate-level training in Organisational Psychology, we cater for those who seek a strong research component (i.e., research MOrgPsych stream), potentially with the desire to progress to a research degree (PhD), and also those who are not so interested in independent research but more in a career in the field (i.e., taught MOrgPsych stream).

We offer **two** 'streams' with a key component of the research and taught streams being a being a research thesis (90 pts) or a research dissertation (45 pts), respectively. Entry to the 'research' stream will be dependent on a minimum GPA at point-of-entry to the thesis and prior satisfactory performance for taught courses in the early part of the degree.

Restriction: Maximum of 45 points from Business/GLMI.

• 45 points from BUSINESS 711, GLMI 702 or 710, 705, 706, 707, 712, PSYCH 700, 715, 716, 717, 731, 758, 768

90 points: PSYCH 794 Thesis

Taught Masters

45 points: PSYCH 761, 766, 744

• 90 points from BUSINESS 705, BUSINESS 711, GLMI 702 or 710, 705, 706, 707, 712, PSYCH 700, 715, 716, 717, 731, 758, 768

45 points: PSYCH 790 Dissertation

Admission

1. In order to be admitted to this degree, a student must have: either

completed the requirements for the Degree of Bachelor of Arts with a major in Psychology, Bachelor of Science with a major in Psychology, Graduate Diploma in Arts in Psychology, Graduate Diploma in Science in Psychology, or Graduate Diploma in Applied Psychology from this University with a Grade Point Average of 5.00 or higher in 45 points above Stage II in Psychology.

or

completed the equivalent to 1(a) as approved by Senate or its representative in approved subject areas (including Business, Education, and Health Science) with a Grade Point Average of 5.00 or higher in 75 points above Stage II.

and

passed PSYCH 306 or equivalent.

2. In exceptional circumstances, Senate or its representative may approve the admission of a student who has attained at least three years of extensive relevant, practical professional or scholarly experience equivalent to the requirements in Regulation 1.

Structure and Content

- A student enrolled for this degree must complete the requirements as listed in the Master of Organisational Psychology Schedule;
- A student must achieve a Grade Point Average of 5.0 or higher in the first 60 points of taught courses prior to enrolment in PSYCH 794A/B;
- A student admitted to this programme must complete the University of Auckland Academic Integrity Course as specified in the Enrolment and Programme Regulations, Academic Integrity, of the *University Calendar*.
