

# Via TRM Student Travel Insurance Terms & Conditions

The University of Auckland (UoA) provides international travel insurance to students with travel registered on Via TRM with the following conditions and circumstances:

## Eligible Travel and Conditions

- 1) Students travelling internationally and returning to New Zealand and whose travel is registered and approved on the Via TRM system, with the exception of
  - a. 360° Auckland Abroad Exchanges of a semester length or longer. Students travelling on this programme are required to purchase insurance separately.
- 2) If those travelling under the UoA travel insurance policy have a pre-existing medical condition<sup>1</sup>, they must complete the <u>Medical Assessment Form</u>. Upon completion of the form if students are directed to advise the insurer of their condition, students should forward the form directly to: <u>traveleasy.nz@marsh.com</u>.
- 3) The official source of advice and risk level for countries is the Ministry of Foreign Affairs and Trade <u>Safe Travel Website.</u> If those travelling under the UoA travel insurance intend to travel to a location which has areas rated as 'high risk' or 'extreme risk' they must seek pre-approval by completing a <u>High Risk Travel Form</u>. It is recommended that travellers who are New Zealand citizens/permanent residents register their details on the Safe Travel website.
- 4) Cover for students is limited to 90 days. Students travelling in excess of 90 days will need to arrange additional insurance. Refer to condition 9, below.
- 5) Students will be covered for up to 14 days of associated leisure travel (e.g. visiting relatives, holiday).
- 6) No cover is provided for family members of students. Cover for family members can be purchased. Refer to condition 9, below.
- 7) Students must have travel insurance in place for the entire duration of their trip. Travel insurance cannot be arranged via the University where the travel is solely for leisure purposes.

### Process for applying

- 8) Provided these Student Travel Insurance Terms & Conditions and other relevant University travel policies are met, insurance cover as stated in the insurance policy will apply for all trips registered through the Via TRM system.
- 9) Should additional cover be required, students can obtain quotes for supplementary or additional insurance by contacting the University's insurance broker directly via email <a href="mailto:traveleasy.nz@marsh.com">traveleasy.nz@marsh.com</a>.
