

Kia ora

Since my message to you last night confirming the positive case of Covid-19 in the University, we have been working closely with the Auckland Regional Public Health Service (ARPHS) to identify locations on campus attended by the student (see below). I need to stress that these have not yet been designated as formal 'locations of interest', although it is possible that some or all of them will be.

ARPHS is currently activating its contact-tracing process and preparing letters that will be sent directly to anyone identified as a 'close contact' based on these locations, with guidance on what steps to take. If you receive this letter, please follow the instructions carefully.

If you do not receive the letter, you are not considered a 'close contact' and are deemed to be at low risk of contracting Covid-19. As with everyone who is not deemed a close contact, if you become unwell or develop symptoms, you will need to get a test. Please phone your GP or Healthline (a 24/7 service with interpreters available) on 0800 358 5453 to arrange this.
