Brief

The <u>Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs</u>) present an opportunity for businessled solutions and technologies to be developed and implemented to address the world's biggest sustainable development challenges.

Please see below sample structure of the business case:

• Sustainable Development Goal (SDG) Specify what <u>SDG</u> your team has chosen to address. What problem are you solving? What challenges and pain points will you resolve?

Overview/situational analysis

Provide an overview of the business case. Think about how to answer the 5Ws (Who? What? When? Where? Why?) before you start your project.

• Recommendations

After setting the "groundwork", present your recommendations and solutions that are not only creative and innovative but more importantly, they need to be feasible, actionable and sustainable.

Financials

Provide a financial summary to support the feasibility and sustainability of the proposed recommendation/solution.

Judging Criteria

- Clarity and coherence of the business case
- Originality, quality, and creativity
- Relevance to the SDG chosen
- Community impact
- Realistic and viability of the business idea
- Financial feasibility
