Form Instructions

Please complete this form, indicating potential courses you have identified for each exchange partner university. The purpose of this form is to demonstrate to us that you have researched all your potential partner universities thoroughly. This form should be uploaded into your application on the 360 International learning abroad portal once completed.

Note that you must list a minimum of **8-10 potential courses for each university** listed on your application, which you believe to be a good fit for your academic programme. We strongly recommend you to list **5** partner universities with your application to improve your chances of being accepted for exchange, however please only list options that you are serious about attending.

- You must be willing and able to attend (i.e. you have identified suitable courses, which are open to exchange/study abroad students) any one of the host universities you list on your application as **we are not able to nominate all applicants to their top choice.**
- It is **your responsibility** to research and take note of any relevant programme restrictions noted on the host university's fact sheet and/or exchange website. It is important that you check that your proposed courses/subject areas are not restricted (e.g. not open to exchange students) at your host university. Do not rely on 'pre-approved' course lists from UoA faculty.
- Please be mindful of which semester each course is typically offered in when referring to the course listings on the host university's website or course catalogue. The academic year for many of our partners begins in Aug/Sept, meaning the overseas university's fall/autumn semester (first semester) aligns with the University of Auckland's Semester 2. The winter/spring semester (second semester) aligns with the University of Auckland's Semester 1.
- Selected exchange partners in Canada (Law Schools) and other countries will have one annual application intake, meaning students must apply to 360 International by the December deadline for Semester Two of the next year or Semester One of the year after next (1.5 years in advance).

If accepted into the 360 International Exchange programme, you will receive a nomination offer for a single partner university, based on our allocation of nomination spaces, and you will work with your Faculty to complete a Course Approval form for the partner university you have been nominated to for your exchange. Please do not request Course Approval forms from your faculty for all partner universities you list here for your application.

IMPORTANT: *The University of Auckland will not nominate students who are planning to study **Computer Science or Electrical Engineering** while on exchange to UC, due to the limited availability of spaces and courses in these departments across campuses.*

Please also check which majors are offered at each campus on [Explore UC courses](#). Research courses at a minimum of **three** of the nine UC campuses. If nominated, you will be **required** to state your three choices on the UC Application Form. **UC decides which campus you will be placed at.** You should be prepared to gain faculty approval for courses at a different campus. Please be aware that courses are not identical from campus to campus.
