#### **EARLY EXIT**

possible option to finish before Christmas

Most faculties offer courses in block 2 that have an "early exit" option (= finish before Christmas). *This is only possible for students who need to return to their home institution for the second semester in January.*In most cases less than 7.5 ECTS is awarded.

**Please keep in mind:** If you want to make use of the early exit option, please contact International Office of your faculty.

Please note that housing through Reserved Accommodation Programme can only be rented for a full semester period and reimbursement due to an early exit is not possible

#### **EXAMINATION PERIOD(S)**

Each faculty has its own schedule. Examinations are based on course work, attendance and exams during the semester.

# Courses on Bachelor's and/or Master's level available for incoming exchange students?

Bachelor's: students need to have completed at least an equivalent of 60 ECTS (one year of fulltime study).

Master's: depending on student's academic level, prerequisites (differs per faculty) and departmental approval.

#### **Transcripts**


Each faculty has its own administration of credits and grades. Transcripts will be sent digitally to the partner university and the student as soon as the transcript becomes available.

#### Language requirements

Excellent knowledge of either ENGLISH or DUTCH is required. Proof of language proficiency is **compulsory** if Dutch or English is not your native language. Consult the table below for your required proof of proficiency. You are required to provide **one** of the documents applicable for your country.

#### **UCU Language Requirements**

Student at fully English taught university, or:

- IELTS: minimum average of 7.0 (for all
- components, with no partial score lower than 6.5) TOEFL and TOEFL IBT home edition: internet based
- Cambridge C1 Advanced/C2 Proficiency: 185 (both with no partial score below 176)



#### **RESIDENCE PERMIT**

Required for all non-EU/EEA citizens staying in The Netherlands longer than 3 months; Exempted from applying for an Entry Visa (MVV) are students with a nationality from:

**Utrecht University** 

- UK
- Australia, New Zealand
- Canada, USA
- Japan, South Korea
- Monaco, Vatican City State United Kingdom (new)

A residence permit is required for all non-EU/EEA citizens staying in The Netherlands longer than 3 months. After official acceptance students will be informed about necessary documents.

#### **ENTRY VISA & RESIDENCE PERMIT**

For students from other countries mentioned on the left, we will apply for an entry visa. The entry visa and residence permit will combined in the procedure. After official acceptance students will be informed about necessary documents.

#### **HOUSING & FINANCES**



Universities in the Netherlands do not own student housing. For new international Erasmus+ / Exchange students who meet the requirements, Utrecht University does offer a Reserved Accommodation Programme. This housing is reserved for new international UU students via organisations like SSH Short Stay. The housing offered through this programme is furnished and available for fixed rental periods only.

Be aware that finding housing via this programme is not guaranteed. The offers are limited and on first come, first served basis. You can find more information on this page:

When to start searching for housing?

It is a good idea to anticipate the time and effort it may take you to find a room, and start your search for housing several months in advance. For students who are eligible for the Reserved Accommodation Programme, the registration and booking dates are posted on the website. If you are eligible, it is possible to apply for this housing prior to your formal admission.

#### **COST OF LIVING**

Jobs for students are available and allowed. Non-EU/EEA students require a work permit and are restricted to a maximum amount of 10 hours working/a week OR full-time in the summer (June - August).
