THE MCTS: AN OVERVIEW

- Explores the causes and dynamics of war, conflict and terrorism
- Examines practical policies and approaches for their prevention
- Students learn about: war, civil war, ethnic conflict, ‘lone wolf’ and directed terrorist attacks, peace-building, post-conflict reconstruction and development (among many other topics)
