Master of Health Leadership

The programme and its specialisations

Participants in this dynamic programme can be practising professionals or preprofessionals. What they will have in common is the desire to develop their knowledge and skills to improve outcomes in the constantly changing field of healthcare.

This new programme encompasses three specialisations:

- **HealthManagement**
- **Clinical Quality and Safety**
- **International Health**

The degree comprises coursework, plus an applied project that completes the qualification.

Students can complete the Master of Health Leadership degree in three semesters full-time study, or in six or more semesters part-time study.

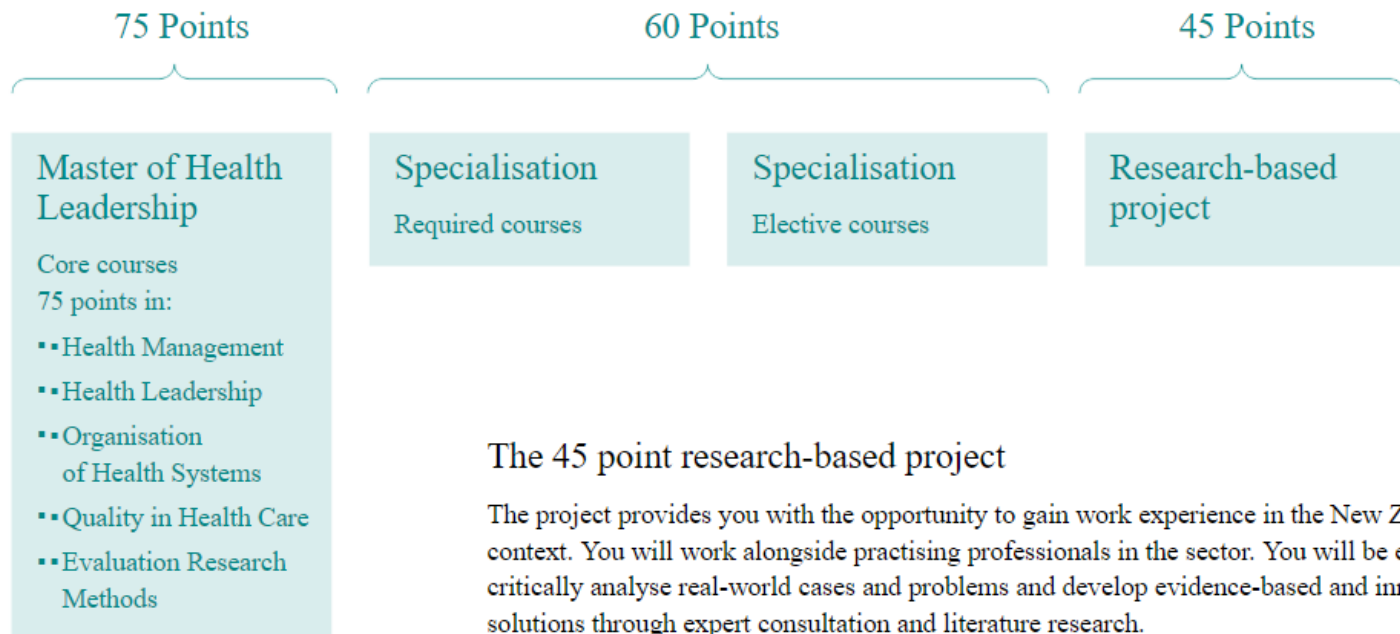
The flexibility of the programme enables current health sector employees (including recent entrants to employment) to combine both work and study.



Master of Health Leadership

- Bachelors degree
- Grade Point Average of 5.0 or higher in the 90 points or equivalent of the most advanced courses taken towards this entry qualification *OR*
- Bachelors Honours degree or Postgraduate
- a Grade Point Average of 5.0 or higher.
- Or In exceptional circumstances Senate or its representative may approve admission of a student who has not met the above requirements, but who has attained an equivalent qualification or relevant professional experience.

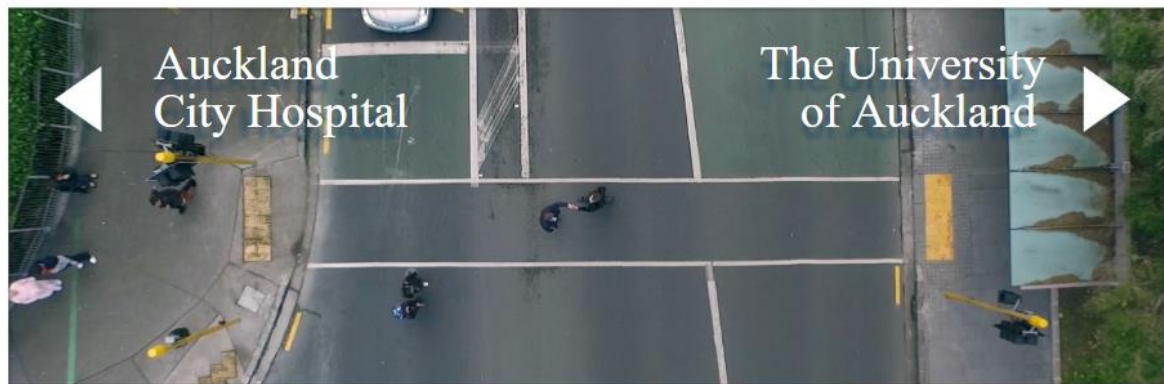
