New Start programmes

New Start is for anyone aged 20 years or older who meets the entry requirements and who wants to gain the skills and confidence to begin at university. The programme is part time, at evenings or weekends, so you can study while you carry on with your other life commitments.

Entry requirements

You must be 20 years or older and a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident. You must also have a good standard of English. We welcome everyone with the potential and drive to succeed. Many capable people don't do very well at school, so please don't let that hold you back from applying!

New Start enables you to:

- · Assess your academic ability and improve your skills
- · Study part-time on a day or evening programme
- · Discover what university is all about
- · Gain an insight into subjects to make informed choices for further study
- · Meet experienced university lecturers and tutors

New Start will open your mind to a range of subjects and help inform your decisions around further study. We invite you to join us and begin your exciting journey as a successful adult learner.

Following New Start, as long as you have achieved the necessary grades and fulfilled other eligibility requirements, you can then be enrolled for an undergraduate degree in the following semester. Admission to Arts, Business, Education and Social Work, or Law will depend on your final grade from New

The New Start programme and courses

New Start General NSGEN 47 will prepare you for an undergraduate degree in Arts, Business, Education and Social Work, or Law. This is the compulsory core programme.

Mathematics Fundamentals NSMAT 10 is a short, intensive summer course taught on Saturdays in a workshop environment. This course is a great way to build your skills and confidence.

Mathematics Preparation for University NSMAT 14 will explore a variety of topics of everyday interest, with the aim of clarifying the underlying mathematics and statistics.

NSMAT 14 is compulsory (together with NSGEN 47) if you plan to apply for an undergraduate degree in Commerce or Property at the University of Auckland's Business School.

Before you're enrolled in NSMAT 10 or NSMAT 14, you're required to sit a 30-minute maths assessment. We'll appraise your results and recommend the right pathway for you.

New Start General NSGEN 47

New Start General is designed to prepare you for entry into a range of degrees at the University of Auckland.

As a New Start student, you'll be introduced to many topics in humanities, social sciences, education and law. Once you've worked out your areas of interest and considered the options available, you can make the right decision about your future study.

New Start General offers you:

- · A programme of weekly lectures, workshops and tutorials
- A choice of locations the University of Auckland City Campus, Tai Tokerau Campus (Whangārei), and Tai Tonga Campus (South Auckland)
- · Access to online course resources
- · Mentoring and peer support
- Part-time study over one semester (13 weeks) in Auckland (The Tai Tokerau programme runs on one Friday and the next seven Saturdays in Summer, or on eight consecutive Saturdays in Semester Two.)
- · Assignments to write and a test to sit
- · The University's Academic Integrity course (ACADINT A01)

Orientation Day

The Auckland programme includes a compulsory Orientation Day. We'll offer you a campus tour and share tips on how to manage your studies. We'll also provide an overview of coursework expectations, course information and your next steps after New Start.

This Orientation for Auckland students takes place at the City Campus before the semester begins.







Lectures

You will attend weekly, two-hour lectures by staff from various disciplines and faculties. The classes will introduce you to a new subject area each week and may include the following:

- · Ancient History
- Anthropology
- · Art History
- Classics
- · Comparative Literature
- · Economics
- · Education and Social Work
- History
- · Law
- · Māori Studies

- · Media, Film and Television
- · Philosophy
- Politics and International Relations
- Psychology
- · Sociology

Note that lecture topics and assignments may vary each semester.

Workshops

During the programme, we run a series of study-focused workshops. These will help you to develop your academic skills and your understanding of what to expect while studying at university. Most workshops run for one or two hours and include the following topics:

- · Assessing your language skills
- · Essay writing skills
- · Life on campus
- · Managing your New Start studies
- Memory, revision and exam techniques
- · Planning your degree studies
- · Reading critically
- Taking notes and reviewing lectures
- · Test preparation
- · Using information technology
- · Using the Library

Tutorials

As well as weekly lectures, you'll attend one-hour tutorials for selected assessed topics during the programme. Tutorials give you the opportunity to ask questions about lectures or assignments. Tutorials are normally held a day or two after lecture classes.

Assessment

The programme includes a variety of assessment tasks, such as quizzes, writing reflections, and essays. You're expected to complete the University's Academic Integrity course (ACADINT A01), engage with DELNA and sit a final test. These assessments will help prepare you for university studies. The results from these assessemnts will be used to assess and support your application to the University of Auckland.

- Make informed decisions, plan an undergraduate study programme and enrol at the University of Auckland

Tai Tokerau Campus programme

New Start General at the Tai Tokerau Campus runs for seven teaching sessions, usually on weekends. In the eighth session, you'll sit your final test.

The lecturing staff are based in Tai Tokerau, so they understand the demands of studying in the North. The classes are small, with quality one-to-one assistance. A high proportion of Tai Tokerau students transition from New Start into degree studies.

The programme focuses on Education because our Bachelor of Education is also taught at the Whangārei campus. The New Start courses include Diversity, Critical thinking, Te Tiriti o Waitangi, History of New Zealand Education, Educational Philosophy, History, and Tīkanga Māori, which are all taught at university. However, when you complete the programme you're not limited to Education. You can enter any of the stipulated degrees.

City Campus programme

City Campus offers the New Start General programme and the New Start Mathematics programme. The lecturing staff are all experts in their fields. They're experienced lecturers who teach in degree programmes. You'll be able to create relationships with future lecturers and familiarise yourself with degree-level teaching and content in a supportive environment. Our teaching staff will be very focused on your transition into degree studies.

City Campus offers state of the art facilities and resources such as computer labs and the library. You'll learn to use Canvas, the University's student portal, and develop other essential skills.

The evening and lunchtime classes mean you can keep working while studying – building friendships and community with other students who are on the same learning journey.

Te Papa Ako o Tai Tonga South Auckland Campus programme

Tai Tonga offers a great opportunity to begin your learning journey at New Zealand's highest ranked university. All our campuses offer the same quality teaching and supportive learning – but at Tai Tonga you'll also benefit from smaller classes.

The campus is right in the heart of Manukau and close to public transport. So you can study where you live, within the community you love. Our facilities are brand new, with state of the art classrooms. You can utilise campus spaces for informal study when you're not in class.

New Start Mathematics NSMAT 10 and NSMAT 14

New Start Mathematics courses are designed to be taken with the New Start General core programme to prepare you for entry into the University of Auckland's Business School. Before enrolling in New Start, you'll need to sit a maths assessment. We'll appraise your results and recommend the right pathway for you.

New Start Mathematics offers you:

- · Weekly lectures and a maths tutor
- · Access to online course materials
- · Mentoring and peer support
- · Part-time study over one semester
- · Assignments and a test to sit
- · The University's Academic Integrity course (ACADINT A01)

As a New Start student, you'll explore a variety of topics in maths. Then, having assessed your areas of interest and available options, you can make the right decision about your future study. We'll provide more detailed information on the Orientation Day.

Mathematics Fundamentals NSMAT 10

This is a short, intensive course taught on Saturdays in a workshop environment. Most of the time you'll be working collaboratively, either as a whole class or in groups, but sometimes there will be lectures.

Mathematics Fundamentals is a great way to build your skills and confidence. It will prepare you well for NSMAT 14.

Assessment

You'll complete two assignments and sit a final test.

Learning outcomes

Having successfully completed the course, you'll be able to:

- · Approach further mathematics courses with increased skills
- $\cdot\;$ Understand the order of operations and factors
- Understand algebra and how it relates to expanding, factorising, fractions and equations
- · Confidently manipulate equations and rearrange formulas
- Gain confidence and speed with metric conversions, ratios and percentages
- · Change numbers by rounding and converting to standard form
- · Understand index laws/powers
- · Grasp the basic geometry of rectangles, triangles and circles
- · Understand how line equations relate to their graphs

Mathematics Preparation for University NSMAT 14

You'll explore a variety of topics of everyday interest, with the aim of clarifying the underlying mathematics and statistics.

Mathematics Preparation for University NSMAT 14 is compulsory (together with the core programme, New Start General NSGEN 47) if you plan to apply for an undergraduate degree in Commerce or Property at the University of Auckland's Business School.

Assessment

During the course, you'll complete three assignments and sit a final test.

Learning outcomes

Having successfully completed this course, you'll be able to:

- Expand and factorise quadratic expressions, as well as solve and graph quadratic equations
- · Understand the basic idea of functions and inverses
- Understand and model exponential growth (such as interest) with functions and graphs
- Master basic trigonometry: Pythagoras, angles, simple trig functions and basic trig equations
- · Use mathematical and statistical approaches to interpret data
- Analyse statistical data with scatter graphs, bar graphs, stem-and-leaf plots and boxplots
- · Understand the terms mean and standard deviation
- · Use the normal distribution to make predictions and estimations
