# UniBound Summer

UniBound runs during the University's Summer School semester, from early January to early February, with an exam covering the academic aspects of the course.

Our programme covers important areas like:

- · Academic preparation for university
- · An exploration of Pacific and Māori cultures and knowledges
- · Off-campus learning activities
- University 101: Understanding the university environment, academics, and student life
- Team-building activities and peer mentoring (from current students)
- Work on projects that give you experience in technology and the culture of research

UniBound is for all Pacific students who have shown interest in, or already applied for, a University of Auckland programme. If you haven't formally applied to the University, we'll help you to do so.

### **Entry Criteria**

To be eligible to apply for UniBound Summer, you must be a New Zealand citizen or permanent resident.

To gain admission to the programme you will need to have:

- · Gained NCEA Level 2 Certificate or its equivalent
- Achieved the literacy and numeracy requirements for University Entrance
- Completed Year 13 at a New Zealand secondary school (or its equivalent) in the calendar year in which you apply for entry

Once you have applied for the programme, a member of our team will contact you about what happens next. Please note that acceptance into the UniBound Summer programme does not imply that your later application for admission to any other University programme will necessarily be accepted.
